*As we move forward we have been told there are still some dark clouds in front of us. With schools being closed for in-person education, there has been an alarming 50% decrease in child abuse reports due to an absence of intervention of school staff. Now that school is back with in-person sessions many community leaders are forecasting a large rise in child abuse reporting. We are prepared to assist those in need.*

*Thank you for everything. We are a beacon of hope to the community because of your efforts. We want to ensure that everyone has a chance for a productive and healthy life.*

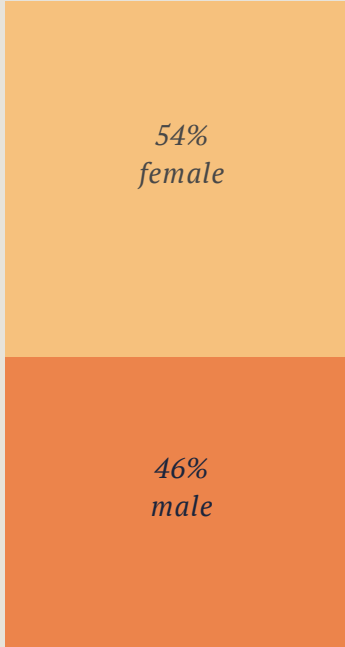

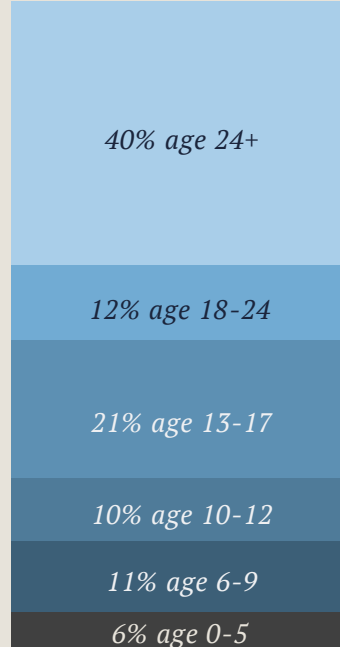

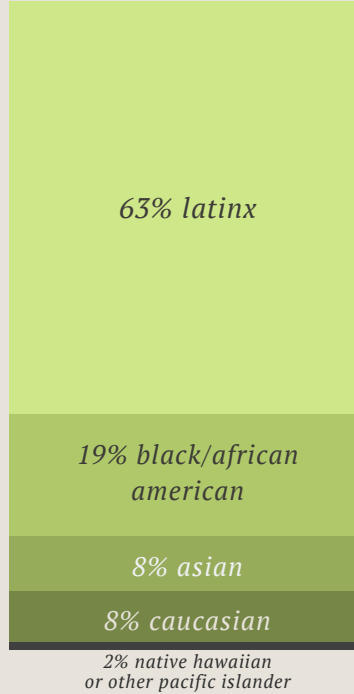
## GENDER



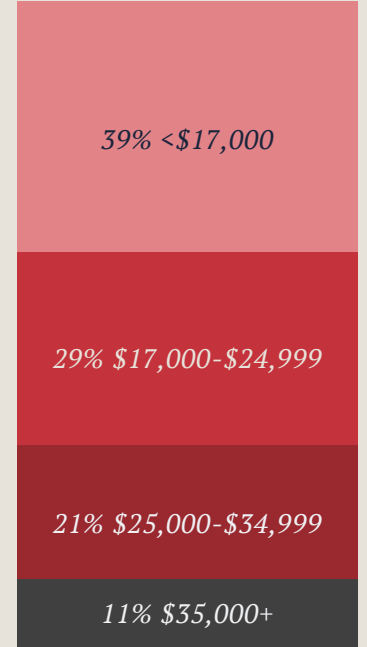
## AGE



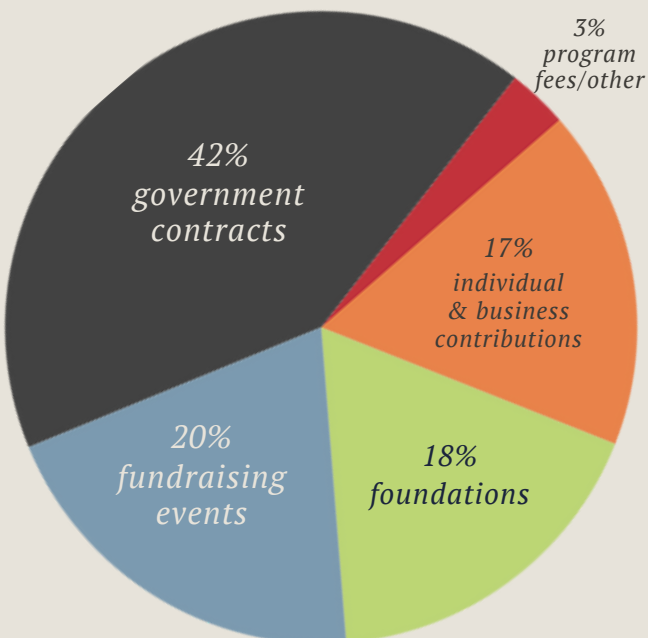
## ETHNICITY



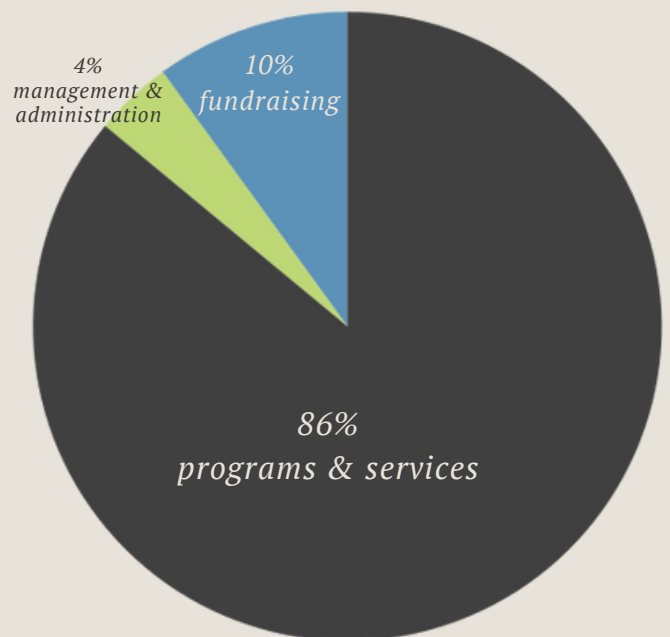
## INCOME

# PROGRAMS & SERVICES

**Lennox Mathematics, Science & Technology Academy** is a new program through which therapeutic services are provided for the students at Lennox Academy. *(112 students served)*

**Kids Club After-School Program** is an on site year-round program providing homework help, tutoring, social skills development, character-building and enrichment activities in a safe environment. *(30 children served)*

**The Everychild Foundation Healing Center** provides comprehensive trauma focused treatment, a myriad of support and educational groups, and wellness programs to both address the needs of children and families in crisis and help them build long-term resiliency. *(1,904 individuals served)*

**Centinela Valley Union High School District** offers crisis intervention, suicide-related assessments, ongoing counseling and support groups, parent presentations and staff trainings at four high schools in the Centinela Valley Union High School District. *(48 students served)*

**Parents as Teachers** provides voluntary, bi-weekly home visitation services to high-risk families with children ages 0-5 in the South Bay, West LA, Watts, and West Athens communities. Participating families engage in case management services, resource and referral connections, parenting education, child development screenings and assessments. *(108 children and parents served)*

**Providence Little Company of Mary** is a partnership program through which Richstone provides individual, family and group therapy at a local community health clinic to promote both physical and mental health in our community. *(68 individuals served)*

Richstone serves as a safe space for RISE students to engage, evolve, and learn. It is our hope that we can serve as a home where student voices are amplified and their needs are prioritized, resulting in a family environment where all individuals feel affirmed, valued, trusted, and supported towards their future goals.
